6.2 Elementary Teachers’ Report (Claudine Houle & Andrée-Anne Pilon)

- A “Developmental Progression Workshop” for the Kindergarten class was held on November 7th with various specialists from the school board observing the students to assess needs and establish early intervention plans.
- The SWL Foundation has granted funds in the amount of \$1,400 for each sector, elementary and high school, to be used towards the purchase of sensory equipment.
- Halloween activities were held. A Bake Sale generated \$400 profit for the student council.
- There will be a “Movember” activity day planned this month and more activities will be organized in December by the student council.
- The skiing activity planned at Mont Tremblant later this winter has been cancelled due to the fact that our school is not in the zone for their program. We are looking for alternate activities to be planned.

6.4 High School Teachers' Report (Julie Wilkins)

- The secondary 2 & 4 students had their respective outdoor excursions during October. Sec. 4 – hiking and Sec. 3 – Tyropark.
- The Citrus fund-raising campaign has ended and an order has been placed with the company. A delivery date is scheduled for mid-December.
- A “Remembrance Day” ceremony will be held on November 10th in the gymnasium for cycle 3 elementary and all high school students.
- The secondary 5 class will be visiting the Synagogue in Ste. Agathe on November 17th. This is a follow-up to their visit to the “Holocaust Museum” in Montreal and to thank Rabbi Carlebach and the synagogue for generously covering the cost of the bus to the museum.

6.7 S.W.L.S.B. Parents’ Committee Report (Jo Morrissey)

Peter MacLaurin, SWL Commissioner, mentioned that the board is experiencing a drop in the enrolment due to students/parents that choose to attend schools that offer specialized programs such as sports and arts.

6.8 S.E.A.C. Committee Report (Samantha Rodgers)

- Four workshops will be presented during the year for parents and teachers. Topics covered will be A.D.H.D., Anxiety, transition from elementary to high school, Special Needs Children: who to talk to at school.
- Parents are encouraged to get assistance from their local C.L.S.C.
- More funds for remedial will be made available for special needs students as well as more computers for student use.
- There are presently 200 coded students throughout the board. These students are entitled to attend school until the age of 21.

6.9 Elementary Student Council Report (Andrée-Anne Pilon)

- Halloween activities were held including a Bake Sale which generated a profit of \$400 for the student council.
- More activities are planned for the month of December.

6.10 High School Student Council Report (Maryse Cloutier & Somiya Colatosti)

- Halloween activities were held such as candy count, pumpkin carving, pumpkin relay race, scary movie, costume contest and a haunted house.
- The November 23rd “Dress down Day” will be in support of the “Movember” cancer month.
- A high school dance is planned for December 15th.
- High school students are asking if turtlenecks respecting school colors can be added to the dress code. This item will be discussed under “Varia”.

Jo Morrissey offered to work with Jacqui Raill’s staff to achieve a finished product that could be presented at a later date for approval.

14.1 Dress Code
